

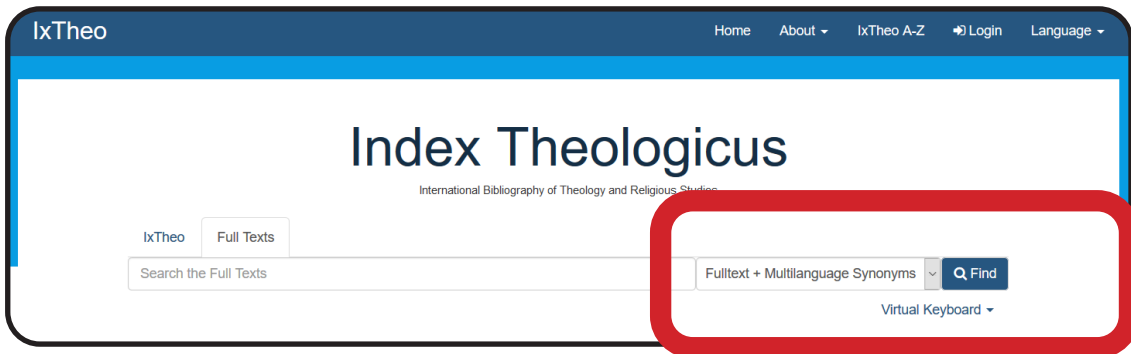


IxTheo :: Full-text search

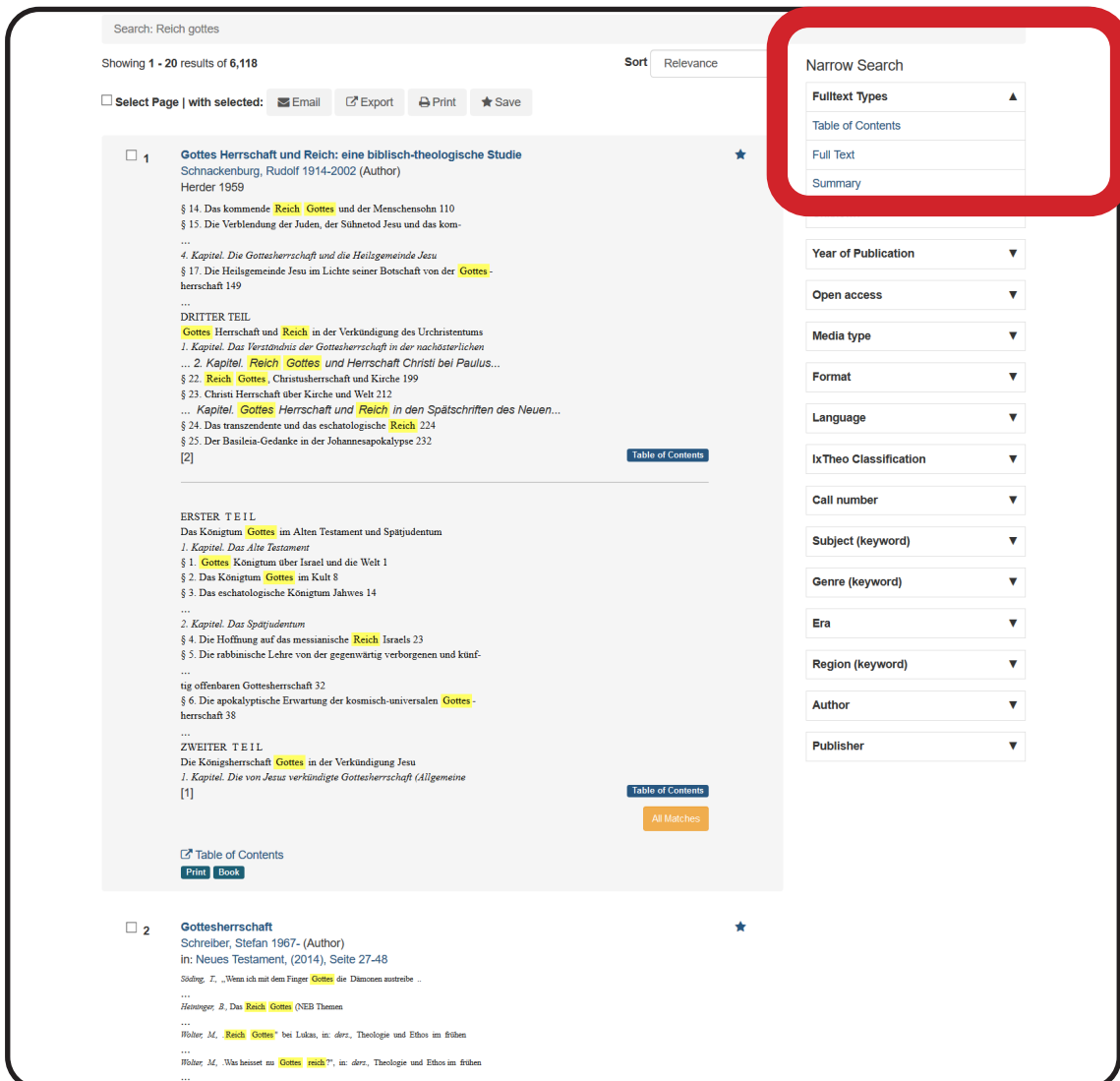


The full-text search expands and modernizes the **search strategy** in IxTheo. It provides a **direct and precise search** capability for single words and phrases in a large **digital corpus**.

The free text search capability is supplemented with **synonyms** and **translations** of a given word in several languages. The selection is made through a selection menu to the right of the search bar.



The search may be narrowed down to specific **text types** (table of contents, full text, summary) and combined with **IxTheo facets**.



In addition, it is possible to conduct a search through the **full text of a selected title**.

The full-text search capability is available for **commercial** as well as **open-access** theological literature. Its added value lies in the fact that it provides a **legally** valid search capability for commercial resources of various publishing houses in an open-access environment.

Our first pilot partners are the publishing houses **Brill** and **Mohr Siebeck**. Other publishers are welcome to join this service.

The searchable **digital corpus** consists currently of **approx. 185.000 digital files**:
>90.000 summaries
>90.000 tables of contents
>5.000 full texts
