#### Ohio Sea Grant & NOAA Release 2021 Lake Erie Harmful Algal Bloom Forecast

NOAA and its research partners are forecasting that Western Lake Erie will experience a smaller than average harmful algal bloom this summer. A relatively dry spring will lead to a repeat of last year's mild bloom, the first time in over a dozen years that mild blooms have occurred in consecutive summers.


<u>Nominations Sought for Positions on the Marine Fisheries Advisory Committee</u> NOAA Fisheries is seeking nominations to fill vacancies on the Marine Fisheries Advisory Committee. The Committee researches, evaluates and provides recommendations to the Secretary of Commerce and NOAA on the development and implementation of agency policies that address science and regulatory programs critical to the mission and goals of the NOAA Fisheries Service. Nominations accepted through July 29, 2021.

**NOAA Fisheries 2022 Saltonstall-Kennedy Grant Competition** The goal of the Saltonstall-Kennedy Grant Program is to fund projects that address the needs of fishing communities, optimize economic benefits by building and maintaining sustainable fisheries, and increase other opportunities to keep working waterfronts viable. Aquaculture-focused projects are encouraged to apply. All interested applicants must submit a 2-page pre-proposal through the Notice of Funding Opportunity posted at Grants.gov. Pre-proposals due by 11:59 pm ET on **August 16, 2021**.

<u>NOAA's Office for Coastal Management Margaret A. Davidson Graduate Fellowship</u> The Margaret A. Davidson Graduate Fellowship is a two-year fellowship program that will place one graduate student at each of the 29 national estuarine research reserves. Through a research project, fellows address a key reserve management need to help scientists and communities understand coastal challenges that may influence future policy and management strategies. Applications are due by **December 10, 2021**.
