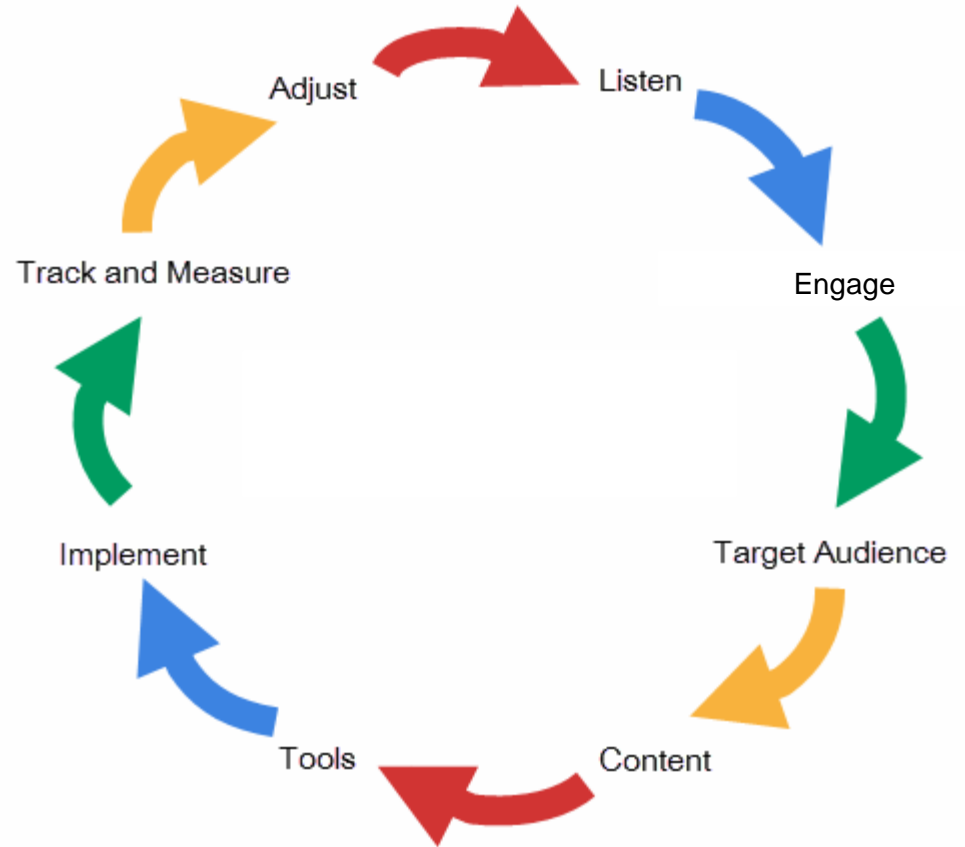

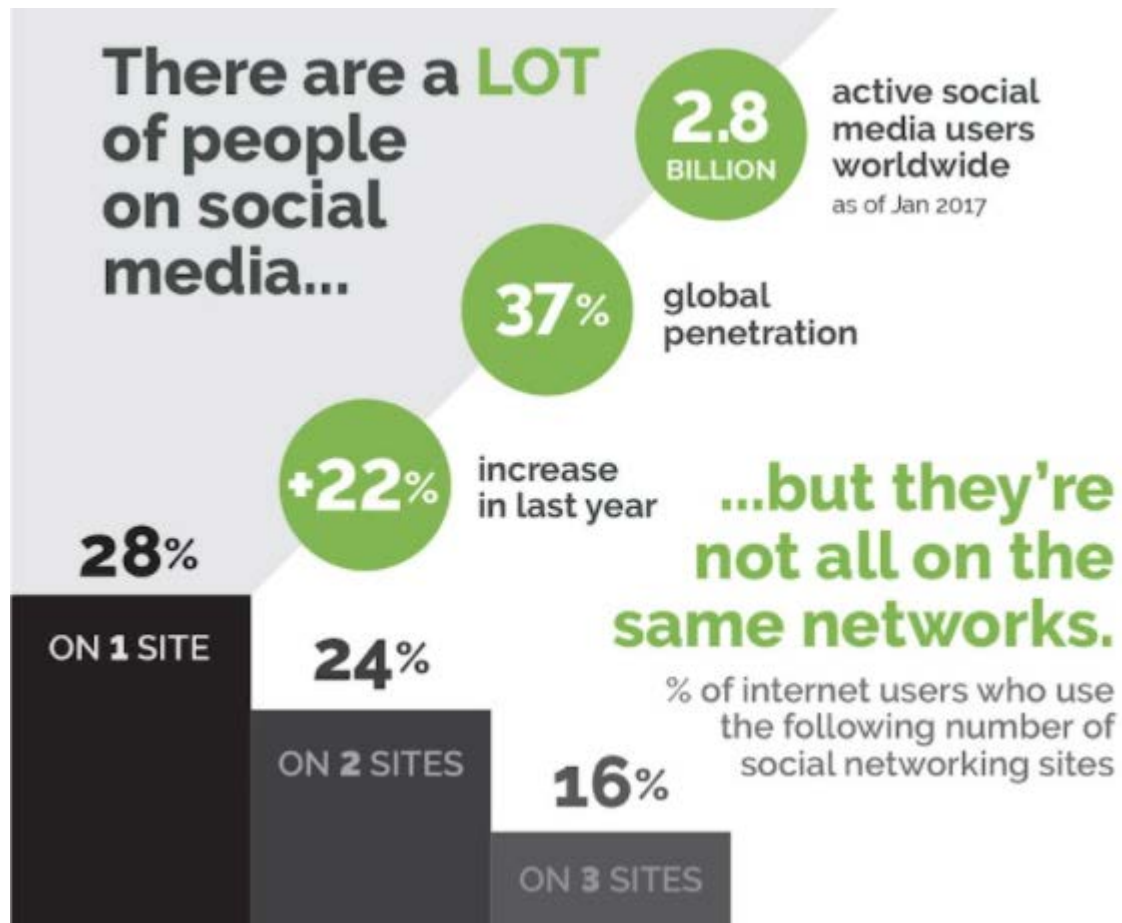

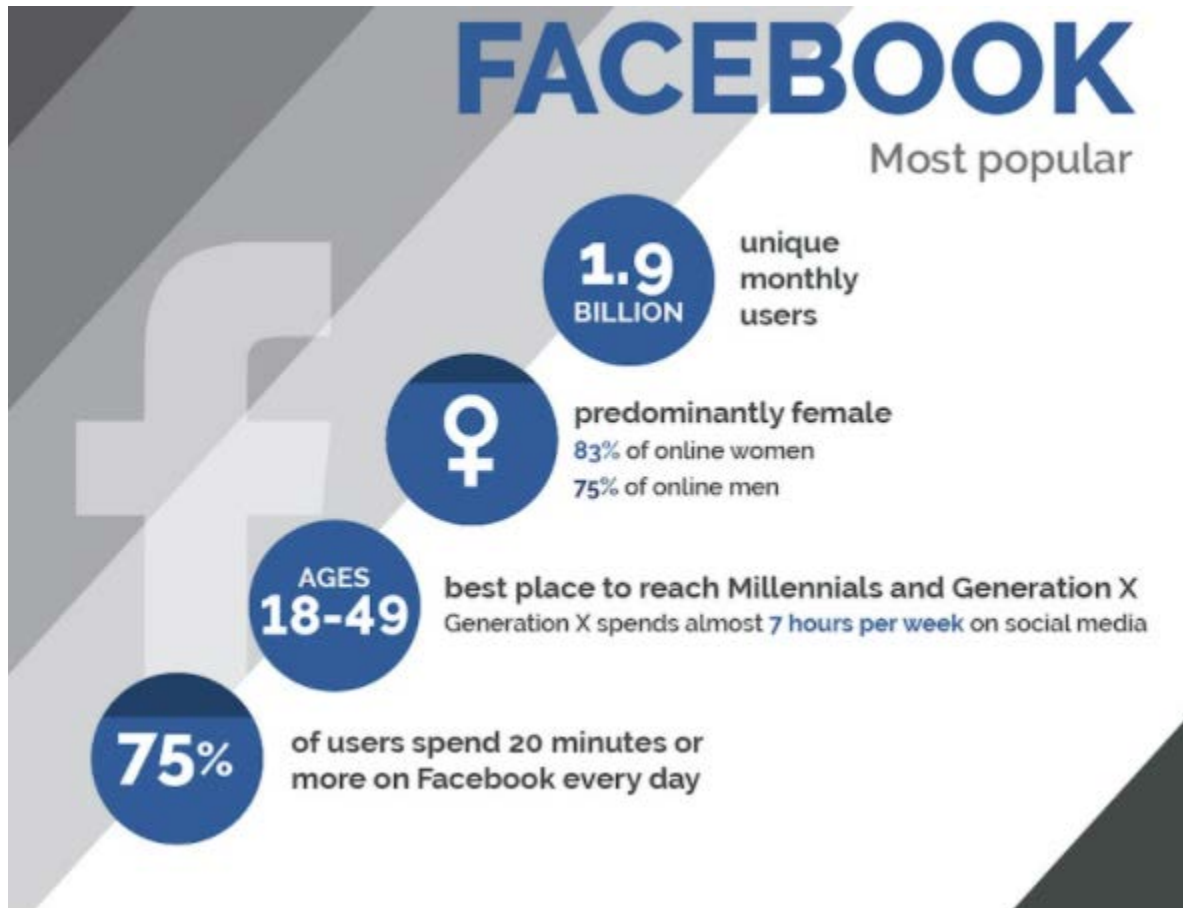
- Tell the NWMO's story in a way that engages the public, allowing them to understand the context of the APM project.

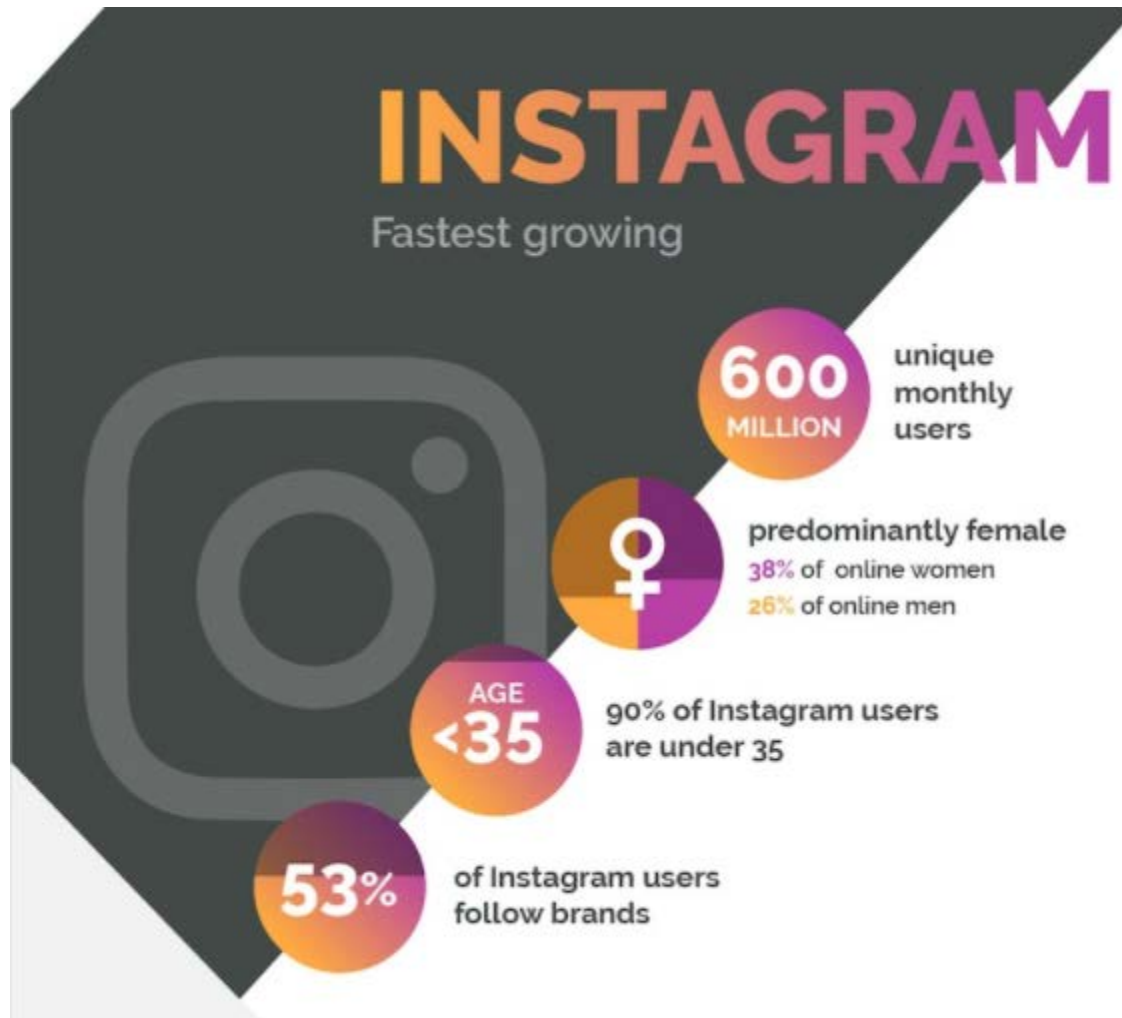

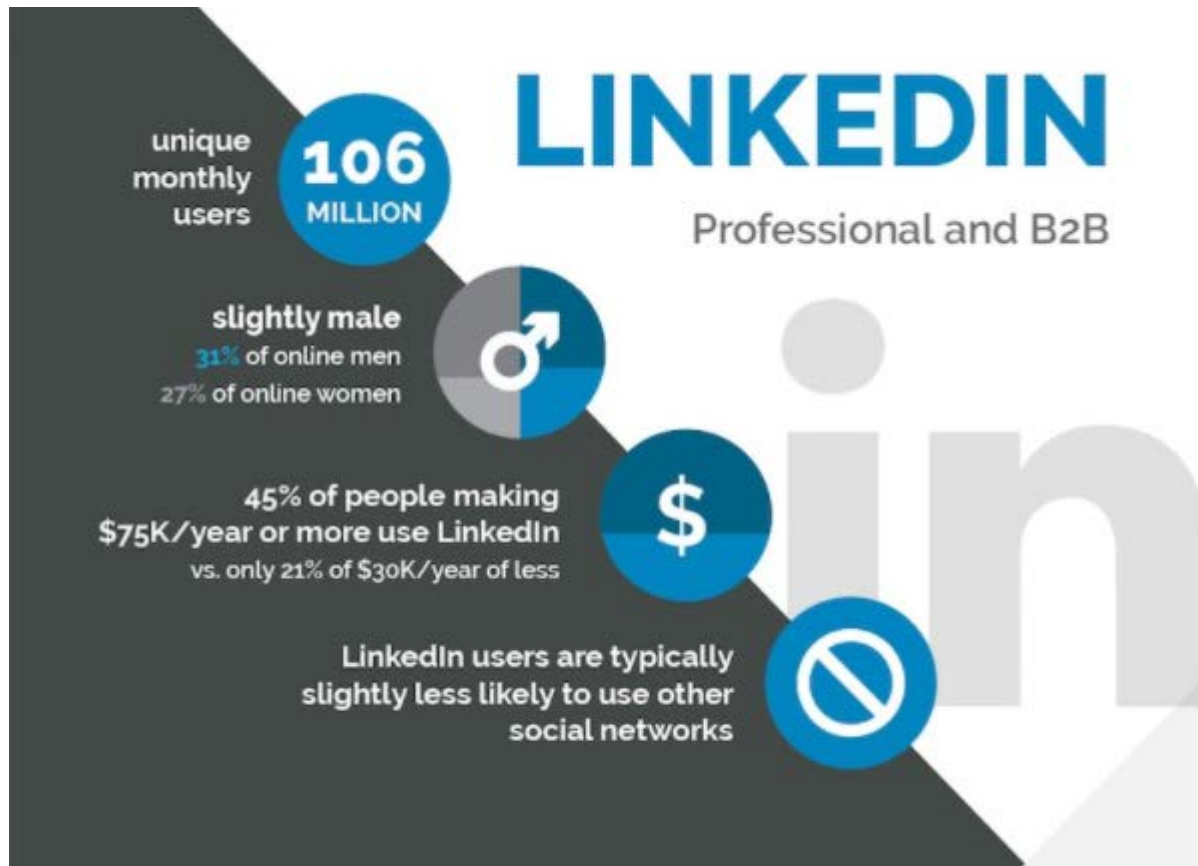
