Two to four inches of rainfall fell in less than 12 hours across western portions of Jackson county near the Princeton community. A total of 3.59 inches of rainfall fell during this time.

Heavy rainfall between 2 and 5 inches of rainfall fell in less than 12 hours. One COCORAHS site 5.9 miles southeast of Huntsville received 2.35 inches of a total 4.26 inches in 2 hours. This caused some minor flash flooding in southeastern portions of Madison county. The Huntsville Times received reports from Huntsville police of debris in the road and flooding at the intersection of Bailey Cover Road and Cecil Ashburn Drive. Also, reports were received of officers being called to several streets in the area to assess water levels for possible road closing in that area.

Abundant moisture ahead of a strong cold front produced heavy rainfall between 2 and 5 inches in portions of northern Alabama east of interstate 65. This caused minor flash flooding in southeastern portions of Madison county and very heavy rainfall in western Jackson county.
