A period of hot weather was observed from the 7th through the 9th, with high temperatures reaching the upper 90s, with 100 to 102 degrees reported at a few locations on the 8th. Heat index values approached or reached 105 degrees.

Heat stress became more dangerous as the daytime heat was preceded and followed by warm evenings in the 80s and overnight low temperatures only in the mid to upper 70s, especially in urban areas. The low temperature on the morning of 7th was as warm as 78 degrees at the University of Alabama in Huntsville (on site location of the National Weather Service).

Temperatures reached 100 degrees on the 23rd through 25th at Muscle Shoals and 24th and 25th at Huntsville. Overnight lows were 75 degrees or higher on all six days, and were in the lower to mid 70s at most locations in north Alabama during the entire period. Heat index values reached or exceeded 105 degrees each day during this period.
