

April 16 Severe Storms in SE Missouri and West Kentucky:

A supercell thunderstorm developed near Zalma in Bollinger County, MO, late in the afternoon. This storm produced hail up to baseball size. The storm produced a funnel cloud over extreme northeast Stoddard County. The storms increased in coverage over Scott County, MO, but weakened somewhat. After dark, the storms then reintensified as they crossed the Mississippi River near Cairo. Large hail, ranging from quarter up to golf ball size, was reported from the Cairo area east to near Paducah.
